CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

- The City of Erlanger has contracted with J.P.S Construction for the below street projects. Traffic delays and road closures can be expected during these projects. Please be cautious when traveling through work zones and use alternate routes.
- The Perimeter Drive Phase 2 Reconstruction Project from 610 Perimeter Drive to the intersection of Perimeter Drive and Arbor Court has begun.
- The Riggs Avenue/Erlanger Road Phase 2 Reconstruction Project has begun and will run from 3163 Riggs Avenue to the intersection of Erlanger Road and Baker Street.
- The Silverlake Avenue/Churchill Avenue Phase 1 Reconstruction Project has begun and runs from Hulbert Avenue to 424 Silverlake Avenue along with all of Churchill Avenue.
- The Sidewalk Replacement Project is still ongoing in Zone 1 that runs from Kentaboo Avenue to Commonwealth Avenue and Dixie Highway to Interstate 75.

SIGN SHOP ACTIVITIES
