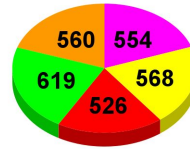
PUBLIC WORKS MONTHLY REPORT

TRAINING

Team members will start back attending virtual and off site training classes in September. These classes are part of the Road Scholar / Road Master program hosted by the University of Kentucky Technology Transfer Center.

September Classes:

Handling Harassment and Violence in the Workplace. Sept. 2nd

PROJECTS

MISTY CREEK PARK IMPROVEMENT

The Public Works Department has finished the sidewalk around Misty Creek playground. The department still has to finish landscaping with four board fencing, plants, seed and straw. Please look forward to a ribbon cutting celebration sometime in October.

SUMMER SEND OFF EVENT

The Public Works Department has been gearing up for the 1st Annual Summer Sendoff. Team Members have installed poles, lights and an entrance to the park event. Please plan on attending on September 18, 2021 from 2:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m.

STREET SIGN REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

The Public Works Department has a 5 year sign replacement program. The material used for making signs is rated for 10 years of service life so all the signs in the City will be replaced on a 10 year schedule which means there is a 5 year period where no signs get replaced except periodic maintenance to signs as needed.

The "No Parking This Side" signs were scheduled to be replaced in 2021. Team members found there were 696 "No Parking This Side" signs throughout the city and identified 54 of them that were not needed and can be taken down. Some sign locations were repositioned to better serve the area they are in. There are now 642 signs throughout the City in compliance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).

CAPITAL PROJECTS

SAGEBRUSH LN / LEXINGTON AVE.

The Sagebrush Lane street replacement project is moving right along with approximately two thirds complete. Jefferson Contracting will be headed to Lexington Drive once Sagebrush Drive has been completed.

WOODWARD AVE.

Humphrey Concrete will be starting the Woodward Avenue project beginning the week of September 13th.

SHADYSIDE DR.

JPS Construction has had a delay on starting the Shadyside Drive project due to Covid 19.

SILVERLAKE PARK.

The Silverlake Park Phase 1 Project is coming to a close with the paving of the basketball court and driveway scheduled for September 7th.
