Mowing



Team Members have made 2 complete rounds of mowing for the month of April, utilizing 250 man hours.

Mowing History

The mowing program for the Erlanger Public Works Department usually runs from late March through late October. The team consist of 4 team members cutting, trimming, pulling weeds and making sure everything has been blown off and left to look like nobody was ever there.

The team cuts 35 locations around the city consisting of just around 60 acres. They range from facilities (4), parks (12) and right of ways(19). The mowing team also schedules time to do routine maintenance on the mowers and other equipment during the mowing season.

The team is also very instrumental in other areas while they are out mowing. Litter control by picking up litter in all these areas before mowing. Checking for any damage or vandalism at our parks to insure a safe play environment. Team Members also carry with them pesticides to spray those unwanted weeds that every homeowner is trying to eliminate.

The mowing doesn't stop there, the team will mow delinquent property with code violations of high grass along with city owned alleys (10) that are cut and trimmed once a month.



The Public Works Department contracted Quinn Electric to add electric to Rainbow Park. This enhancement will be beneficial with park events moving forward.

In the near future you can look forward to water being added for a water fountain.





Team Members have moved onto bed mulching around the city. They have completed the Depot Park. The black dyed mulch really adds to the beauty of the park.







Silverlake Park has been completed with all the beds edged and fresh mulch.





Team Members are currently edging and mulching in The Glades and will continue through Spring Valley Park.



CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

The City of Erlanger has contracted with JPS Construction for the Alpha Court, Beta Court, Kelli Lane and Michelle Circle Capital Improvement Street Reconstruction Projects. These projects will be full pavement removal of the center islands in the cul-de-sacs along with identified sidewalk panel replacement.

Michelle Circle has completed its first of three pours.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

- The Center Street Improvement Project is underway with the drainage and full depth repairs being completed. The next steps will be to mill the existing pavement, apply the leveling layer of asphalt, replace curbs and driveways aprons and then the final surface layer of asphalt.
- The Brightleaf Boulevard connector from Turkeyfoot Road to Narrows Road had been planned to begin on Thursday 4/25/19 but due to the rain the start was delayed. The first step on this project will be to remove the existing curb cuts (5) and replace with full curb, remove and rebuild ADA sidewalk ramps. After the concrete has cured the contractor will then mill the existing pavement, apply a leveling layer of asphalt with the surface to complete the project.
- The Atlas Drive portion of these three asphalt resurfacing project is a milled keyway and overlay which will fall in line with asphalt portion of Center Street and Brightleaf Boulevard projects.
- The Public Works Department will also be starting two parking lot resurfacing projects, on at the City Building (rear lots) and the other at Safety Center East (4100 Narrows Road)

TRAINING
