STREET SWEEPING

The Public Works Department is responsible for sweeping all City maintained streets along with various State Routes four (4) times annually. The fourth and final round for 2019 has been delayed due to the amount of salt residue that was still on the street from the last Winter weather event.

SNOW REMOVAL



The City experienced its second snow event on December 16. With the predicted snow accumulation of 1-3 inches and the temperatures falling to the low 20's, the Public Works Department proactively started their shift at 10:00 p.m. to stay ahead of icy conditions and to guarantee a smooth commute. All went well and the streets were clear for the morning commute.

SNOW REMOVAL

The Public Works Department starts in March by filling the salt barn to 1800 ton capacity. At this time inventory is checked and extra plow parts and cutter bars are stocked.

In October/November when inclement weather is forecasted, snow plows and spreaders are installed on all equipment that is used in our snow and ice control service.

Snow and ice removal operations begin when slippery conditions are expected or snow starts to accumulate. Each team member has a designated route that he has been thoroughly trained in to effectively and efficiently cover

the entire city.



When inclement weather is forecasted, 2 / 5 man teams are placed on primary and secondary call, on an as needed basis. Each team will work a 12 hour rotation if necessary or until all streets are cleared and the weather system has passed.

The Erlanger Public Works depends on several warning sources for weather and road conditions. The police department sergeants will notify dispatch and the on call team if road conditions become hazardous. The Erlanger operations manager will also monitor several local and national weather channels for any threatening weather in order to be proactive in determining whether crews should report before weather system starts.

LEAF COLLECTION

The City's Leaf Collection Program started on October 21st and concluded on December 6th. The Public Works Team visited every street four times during this seven week program.



The City's Leaf Collection Program is a terrific service for the residents in disposing of unwanted leaves. It also helps with the clogging of catch basins and drains from flooding. It improves the appearance of the City as a whole.

Christmas Tree Lighting

This year the Christmas Tree Lighting was moved from the Depot Park to the City Building, not only did this give the entrance to the City a bright and shiny appearance but also gave the community more room to gather and enjoy the festivities.

Street Improvement Projects

Turfway Road / Circleport Entrance

TMS Construction has completed the Turfway Road / Circleport Entrance project. The bus stop shelter located at the corner of Turfway Road and Dolwick Drive looks fantastic. Landscaping and mulching have been completed as well.

The sidewalk seen in the photo above will connect with the sidewalk that is part of the Grant Project that will run along Dolwick Drive to Mineola Pike.





CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

Narrows Road, Sherbourne Drive, Old Turkeyfoot Road, Lakemont Drive and Ashmont Drive are all part of the resurfacing project.

- Narrows Road, Sherbourne Drive (Richardson to Skye), Old Turkeyfoot Road (City section only), Lakemont Drive and Ashmont Drive project will include asphalt overlay with miscellaneous sidewalk improvements.
- Public Works staff conducted a public workshop in the month of July
 where all residents located within the vicinity of the planned improvements
 were invited to meet with City staff and review drawings, review the scope
 of the project to how they could be impacted and to provide staff with
 input. Due to the large amount of residents being affected by this
 improvement project this workshop was conducted in council chambers.
- This project is scheduled to start in the spring of 2020 by Michels Construction.

2020/2021 Capital Street Projects

Public Works Staff Members have met with the City Engineer to begin the design stage for our upcoming capital improvement projects. The following streets are in the design stage at this time.

- Carriage Hill Drive
- Delphi Drive
- Mesa Drive
- Valleywood Court

This will enable us to bid early and get on the schedules for interested contractors.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

Crack Sealing

- The Department's Crack Sealing program has two primary purposes:
 - 1. To prevent the intrusion of water through pavement cracking allowing water to penetrate the underlying pavement subgrade causing premature pavement failure.
 - 2. Crack Sealing program prevent extraneous materials from entering the crack and causing further deterioration as the pavement expands and contracts with temperature changes.
- The City has contracted with Michels Construction to perform all 2019 / 2020 Crack Sealing. Work is planned for Zone 1 and is scheduled for spring 2020.
