- The Sidewalk Replacement Project is on hold for the time being due to winter weather, our contractor will resume in Zone 2 in the spring.



Staff continues to work on several issues and concerns throughout the city.

Team Members patched **179** potholes utilizing **155** bags of cold patch.

SIGN SHOP ACTIVITIES

- During the month Team Members installed 3 new signs utilizing 3 poles and 2 anchors.
- Duke Energy is still in the process of installing the decorative street lights on the corner of Dixie Highway and Commonwealth Avenue.
- There have been 3 new street lights reported to Duke Energy or Owen Electric to be repaired.
- Two Team Members replaced all 490 stop signs and 282 allway signs in the city to be compliant with the MUTCD, Sign Reflectivity Program.
