Street Striping



Each year the City of Erlanger bids the Street Striping Program. The program is designed to refresh the striping that has faded or is worn away due to traffic conditions throughout the city.

One of the most important aspects of a safe and efficient roadway is the uniform application of pavement markings to delineate the roadway path and specific traffic lanes. Pavement markings can communicate information to road users like no other traffic control device. They provide continuous information to road users related to the roadway alignment, vehicle positioning, and other important driving-related tasks.

To ensure consistent application of pavement markings, their characteristics and warranting criteria are described in the *Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices* (MUTCD) setting national standards on their application.

UPCOMING PROJECT

- Woodchase Drive, Heartwood Lane and Summerwood Court will be concrete replacement project.
- Silverlake Avenue (Riggs to 426 Silverlake Avenue) will be concrete replacement.
