Storm Sewer/Issues Report/Problem Checks

Problem storm locations were checked and cleaned **3** times in the month of March.

Staff continues to work on several issues and concerns throughout the city.

STORM INLET/CHOKE POINT HISTORY

There are many storm inlets or choke points that the **Public Works Department** check before and after heavy rain is predicted. Heavy rainfall can cause flooding, sewer backups and water problems for homes and roadways if these storm inlets and choke points are not free of debris.

The Public Works Department is responsible for all storm inlets/choke point above ground including grates, concrete, all openings and debris removal.

Everyone has a part to play with storm water and storm inlets.

- Clear areas of debris before and after.
- Blow grass clippings back into yard, this helps fertilize your yard.
- Pick-up newspapers and ads.
- Dispose of trimmed tree branches and other landscaping material.

This debris will eventually end up in a drainage ditches and creeks, which could block inlets or outfalls causing flooding.

Call SD1 if there are any sinkholes or any signs of storm system failures, such as pipes falling apart.

SIGN SHOP ACTIVITIES



- During the month Team Members installed 10 new signs utilizing 3 poles and 3 anchors.
- Duke Energy is still in the process of installing the decorative street lights on the corner of Dixie Highway and Commonwealth Avenue.
- There was 8 new signs produced for Erlanger Farmers Market on 18x24 coroplast.
- There were 124 sticker made for the Tichenor Middle School Field Trip on March 21st.
- There were 32 regulator signs printed and sheeted, 30 of those being No Parking this Side.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

- Narrows Road / Nelson Road Intersection Improvement
 Project will resume as weather permits. The asphalt
 walking paths that will connect to the Glades walking path
 will be installed in the spring, once plants are up and
 running for the season.
- The Alpha Ct., Beta Ct., Kelli Ln., and Michelle Cr. Project will resume this spring, updates will be posted as to when dates are determined.
- The Sidewalk Replacement Project is back underway with the section of Erlanger Road between Cowie Avenue and Dixie Highway being the starting point in Zone #2.
 Restoration work on areas that had taken place late last fall are being gone back over as well.
- The Atlas Dr. Brightleaf Blvd. (between Narrows Rd and Turkeyfoot Rd) and Center Street projects will begin this Spring as well.
