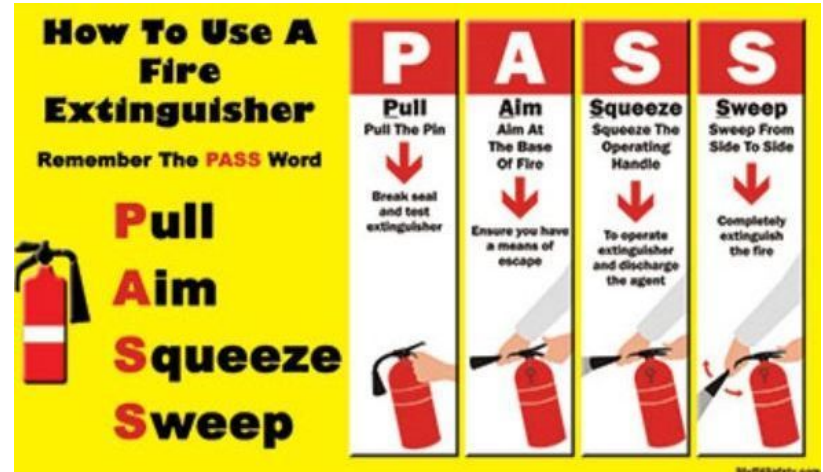

July 2019

With the hiring of 8 new Members, each Shift is working to get the new Members their required hours for Kentucky Professional Firefighter Certification. This certification requires 400 hours of training in numerous specific areas.



Life Safety Inspections

The Department performs Life Safety Inspections for all public buildings in the City of Erlanger. During a Life Safety Inspection, Members meet with business representatives and check the buildings to ensure that all codes are met, proper inspections (fire alarm, sprinkler, hood suppression systems and boiler) are maintained, fire extinguishers are current and general fire hazards are recognized. If discrepancies are located, a re-inspection can be performed after the corrections are made. The Department is responsible for over **550** inspections throughout the year.

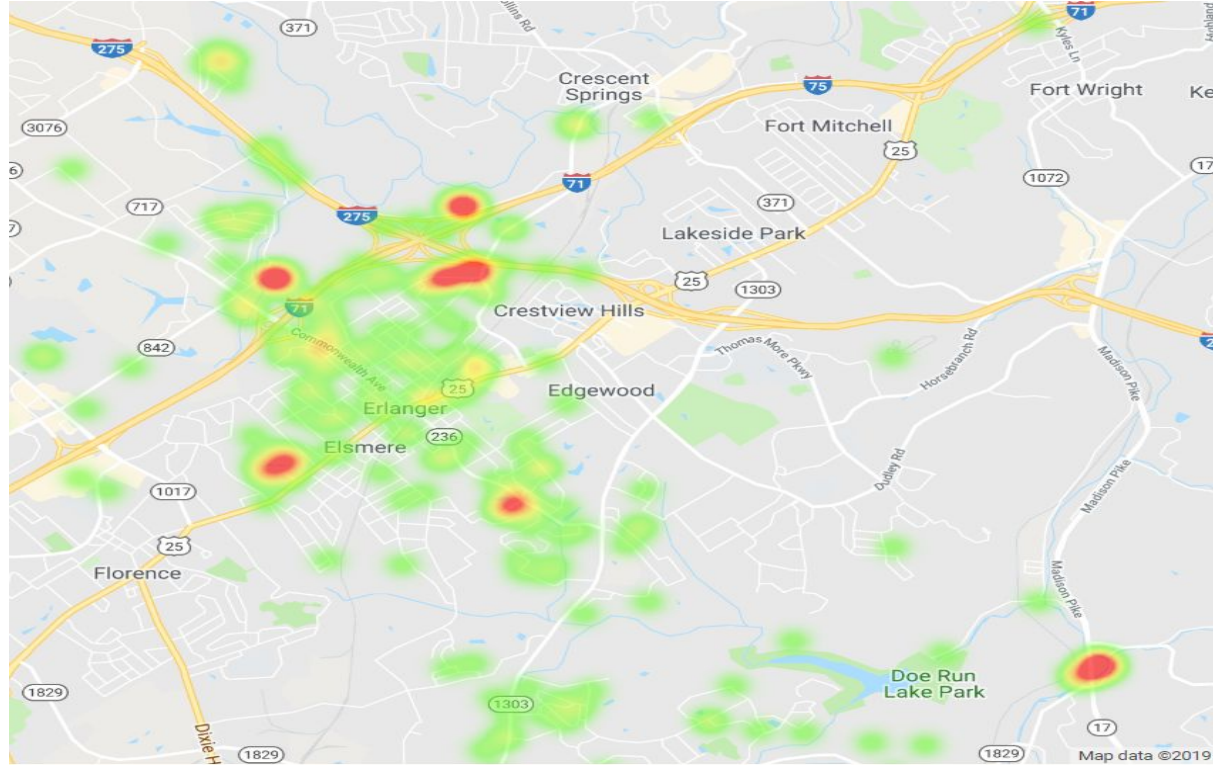
