Active Shooter Training

June 2 - 4 2019

All Crews attended SAVE (Swift Assisted Victim Extraction) training at Lloyd Memorial High School. It is an unfortunate reality that we are faced with the real possibility of a mass shooting, but preparing for such an incident is nonetheless imperative. Our Members, as well as Members from the Elsmere Fire Department and Point Pleasant Fire District, met in order to improve our response to such an incident.







Reading Smoke

June 10 - 12 2019

When people think of fire, smoke is an afterthought. Years of research into smoke (brown, grey, black, white) has produced information as to the type of fire, what is burning, the amount of oxygen and the fire intensity. Crews focused on "Reading Smoke" to increase our ability to predict the fire we will be dealing with.










Ladders

June 17 - 19 2019

Ladders have been a part of the fire service since early times. Ladders not only have the ability to save a person from a window or reach a fire, but they also assist with ventilation. All Crews reviewed the parts of the ladder, the various sizes and configurations we carry, and how to properly deploy the ladders.











Hose Testing

June 2019

Every year the Department is required to test each section of fire hose. We carry 1 ¾", 2 ½", 3" and 5" hose for various purposes. When testing the hose, we connect it to a pumper and charge the line with water while increasing the pressure. The pressure is maintained for five minutes, and the hose must withstand the pressure with no bulges or leaks. The Department owns over 300 sections of hose.

New Hire Orientation

June 24 - July 05 2019

With the transition to Full-Time staffing, it was necessary to hire 7 new Members. They are required to complete a two-week Orientation process. New Personnel will be Sworn-In at the July 2nd Council Meeting, and start their assigned shifts on July 7th.







Life Safety Inspections

The department performs Life Safety Inspections for all public buildings in the City of Erlanger. During a Life Safety Inspection, members meet with business representatives and check the buildings to ensure that all codes are met, proper inspections (fire alarm, sprinkler, hood suppression systems and boiler) are maintained, fire extinguishers are current and general fire hazards are recognized. If discrepancies are located, a re-inspection can be performed after the corrections are made. The department is responsible for over <u>550</u> inspections throughout the year.
