Driver - Operator Training

March 4 - 5 - 6 2019


With the upcoming delivery of our new fire engines (Engine 51 and Engine 53) there is a substantial amount of training required to certify Members on operational and driving procedures. The first class was a driver/operator lecture. This training covered the operation of the trucks, state laws, departmental rules and various other operational needs.



Pump Operations and Calculations

March 5 - 6 - 9 2019

Members that will be driving our new fire engines must pass a pump operations test. We provide both classroom and hands on learning to prepare our Members for the test. Pumping the truck requires a Member to be able to connect to a fire hydrant and charge various hoselines with water within a set amount of time. We concentrated on the classroom portion first, which reviews the necessary math and calculations to supply fire attack teams with the correct water pressure in hoselines.






MSA SCBA Orientation

March 11 -12 - 13 2019

Our Department received a grant to purchase new self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) since our current Scott air packs are over 11 years old. After research and review, our Department decided to purchase MSA G1 air packs from Vogelpohl Fire Equipment. The first step in placing the new air packs in service was an orientation provided by Vogelpohl, where Crews were instructed in the proper use and





MSA SCBA Facepiece Fit Training

March 11 - 12 - 13 2019

The facepiece is a crucial part of the self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). The proper seal keeps smoke and hazardous materials from entering our lungs. To ensure a proper fit, Members perform a fit testing procedure each year, where their mask is connected to a machine and computer that detects leaks. The Member is required to perform various tasks while connected to the machine, ensuring a tight seal.







Locust Street Fire Critique

March 15 2019

After Crews are involved in fighting a structure fire, or a larger scale incident, we meet to discuss our operations so we can improve and learn from the incident. Members from Erlanger and Point Pleasant Fire Departments met, reviewed audio from the radio traffic, and took turns recounting the various tasks completed at the Locust Street Fire.







MSA SCBA Practical Exercises

March 18 - 19 - 20 2019

The next evolution in the training program for the new self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) was practical exercises. Members used repetition in assembling the new pack, donning the pack, and breathing air. Members also had to locate pieces of the air pack hidden in a dark room while wearing their fire gear, assemble the pieces correctly, don the pack, and start breathing air to end the drill.








MSA SCBA - RIT Operations

March 25 - 26 - 27 2019

Rapid Intervention Teams (RIT) are teams of firefighters grouped at any incident that may pose a threat to our firefighters (structure fires, hazardous materials leaks, water/ice rescue, etc). This team, when activated, is tasked with rescuing downed firefighters. With the purchase of our new MSA Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA), Members must learn to use the new RIT breathing air system.







Driver's Training - Obstacle Course

March 25 - 26 - 27 2019

With the delivery of our new fire engines (Engine 51 and Engine 53) each Member must be able to drive the truck through a standardized obstacle course. The course is designed to simulate various tasks a driver may face while driving on the open road.





Life Safety Inspections

The department performs Life Safety Inspections for all public buildings in the City of Erlanger. During a Life Safety Inspection, members meet with business representatives and check the buildings to ensure that all codes are met, proper inspections (fire alarm, sprinkler, hood suppression systems and boiler) are maintained, fire extinguishers are current and general fire hazards are recognized. If discrepancies are located, a re-inspection can be performed after the corrections are made. The department is responsible for over <u>550</u> inspections throughout the year.
