PROGRAMS Mowing


Mowing is in full swing in all of our parks and our right of ways. The graph below shows man hours for the month of May for the last 5 mowing seasons. These man hours are calculated using a crew size of 4 team members and all locations been cut an average of 4 times during the month.

Man Hours for a 5 Year Cycle




Street Maintenance Pothole Patching

The chart shows a 5 year comparison of pothole patching in the month of May, the amount of material used and the man hours that it takes to fill potholes.

The bags of mix that the department uses is a 50 lb bag of high performance asphalt cold patch. So you can see that in 2017, the team used 63 bags of 50 lb cold patch which is equivalent to 1.5 tons of bulk mix.

The Public Works Department is moving right along with the installation of the new playground equipment with the pouring of the first section of the sidewalk and the construction of the wall. Amenities at the park when the play structure is complete will include:

- Play structure for preschool children 2 to 5
- Play structure for school-age children 5 to 12
- 6 foot concrete sidewalk bordering the play equipment
- A beautiful sitting wall built into the hillside.
- Landscaping with trees and shrubs.




CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

The Hickory Lane street replacement project is wrapping up, the concrete portion on Hickory Lane is complete with a small amount of restoration remaining for completion of project.





Training

Mowing, mower safety and mower maintenance:

Leadership training on a monthly basis:

Technical training on a monthly basis:

One team member is assigned to put on some type of technical training every month such as equipment maintenance, concrete tools or sign reflectivity. This team member is responsible for gathering all the needed information and anything else needed to conduct the training class.

All team members took part in pouring a section of sidewalk at MIsty Creek Park that will be part of the new playground being installed. This was several of the team members first time doing concrete so it was a great opportunity and learning experience to let them get there hands wet (so to speak).
