

PROJECTS

MISTY CREEK PARK IMPROVEMENT

The Public Works Department has finished the four board horse fence and the installation of landscaping. The ribbon cutting is scheduled for late October.

SUMMER SENDOFF

The Public Works Department participated in the first ever Summer Sendoff event on 9/18/21. Team Members were divided into three shifts throughout the day to ensure everything was a success.

PROGRAMS

STREET SWEEPING

Street sweeping not only makes the streets cleaner, it is an important part of stormwater pollution prevention. It prevents unwanted materials from flowing into the storm drains and polluting our streams, causing backups and flooding. The team made one complete round through the entire city but also ran the main corridors on two other occasions.

CHOKE POINTS

The Public Works Department has areas within the city that flood with heavy rainfall. These areas are refer to as the "Nasty Nlne". When heavy rain is predicted the department will check these areas to make sure they are clear of debris. To try an ensure that the water moves through freely without any obstructions. These areas were checked 7 times this past quarter.

CAPITAL PROJECTS

The Sagebrush Lane street replacement project is wrapping up with just one section of street to be replaced along with a small amount of sidewalk. Lexington Drive will begin the week of October 4th 2021.

WOODWARD AVE.

The Woodward Avenue project has began with four pours of 200 feet a piece for a total of 800 feet being completed.

SHADYSIDE DR.

JPS Construction is back to full staff and fully operational with two sections of the Shadyside Drive project removed and replaced.

SILVERLAKE PARK.

The Silverlake Park Phase 1 Project is wrapping up with just the color coat and striping of the basketball courts remaining, this portion of the project is slated for the week of Oct. the 18th.
