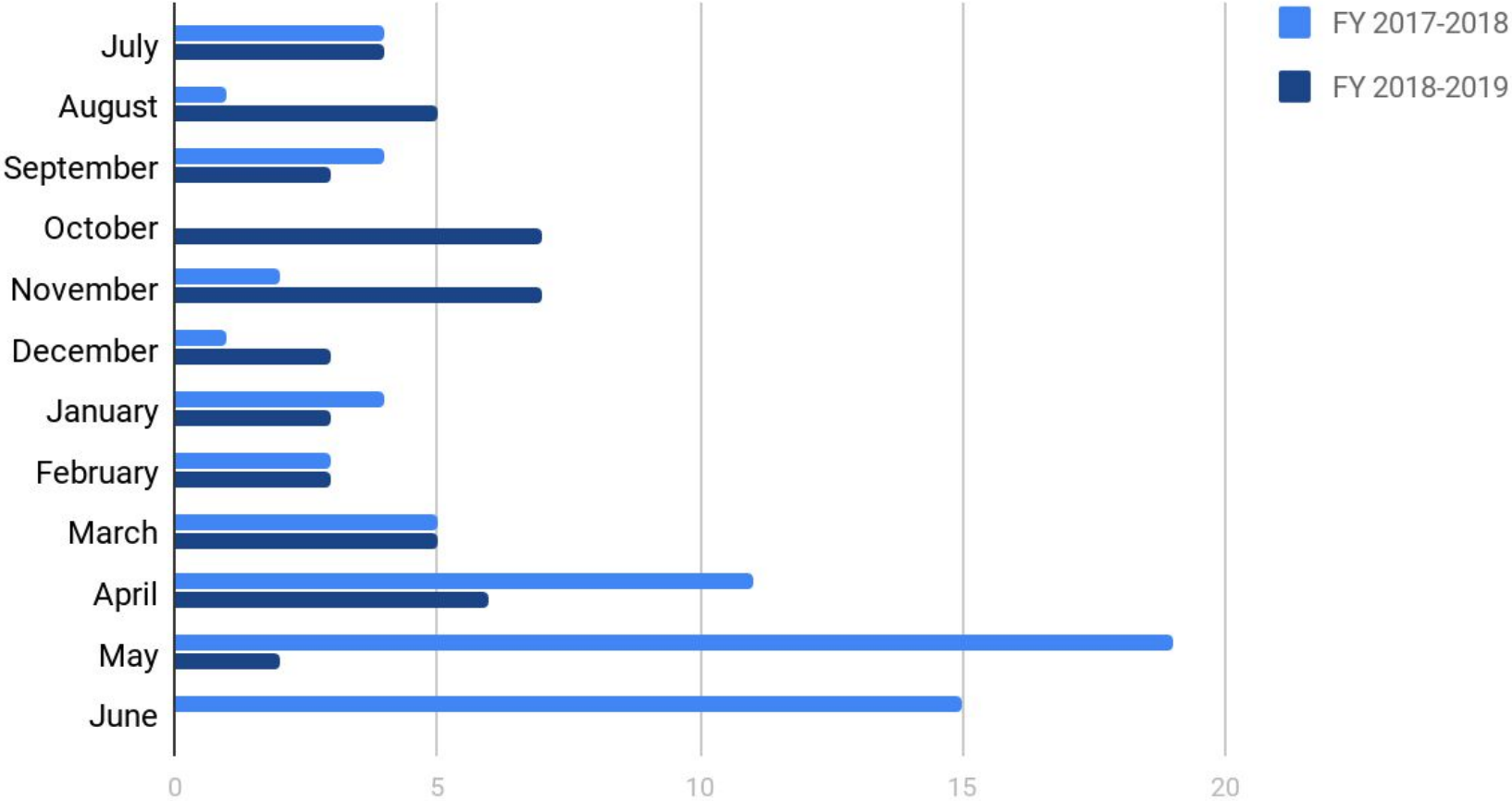
ADMINISTRATION REPORT

Please find below a brief review of activities that have taken place during the last month along with upcoming items for the current month. As always, please feel free to contact me with any questions.

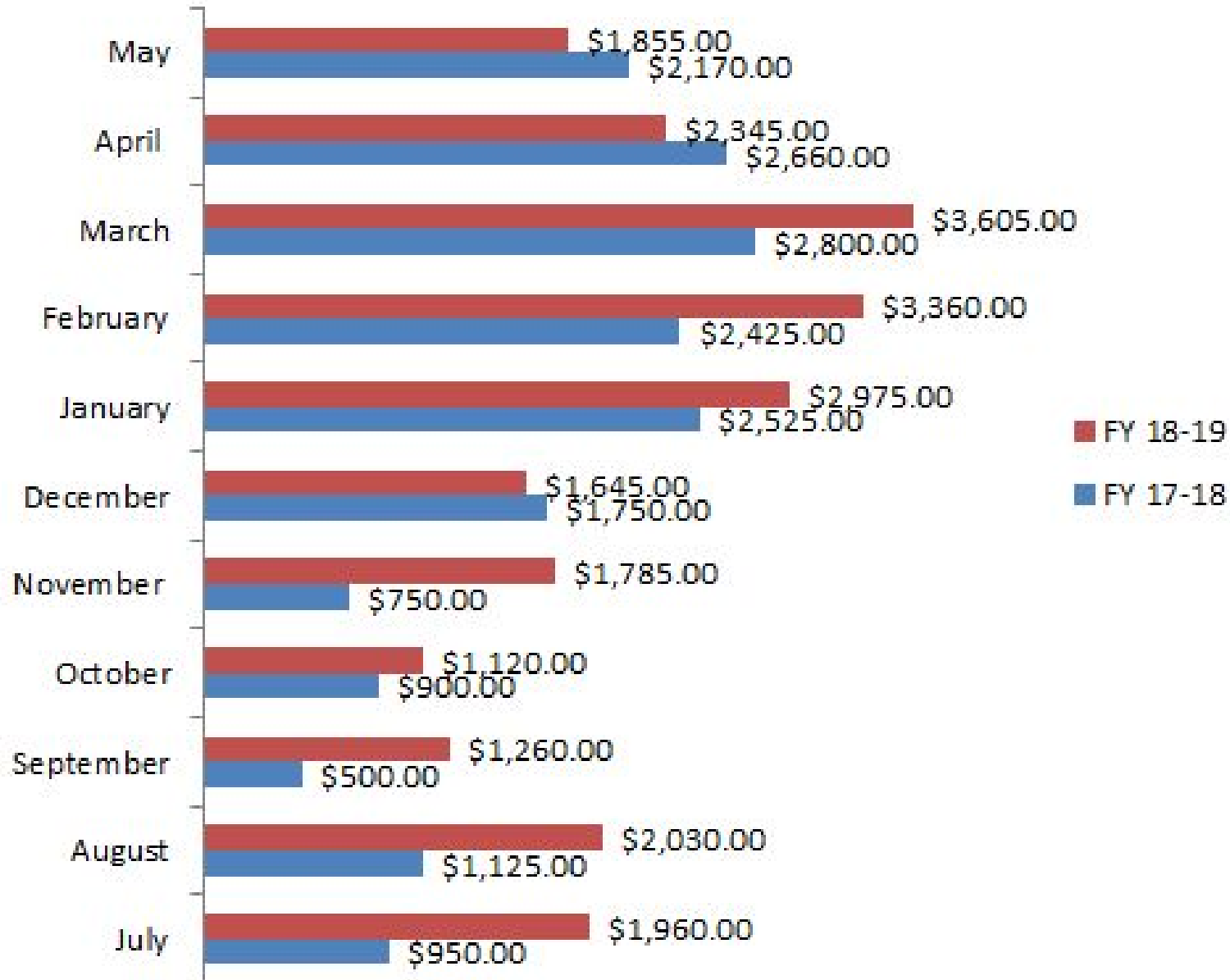
Legislation

Passport Fees Collected



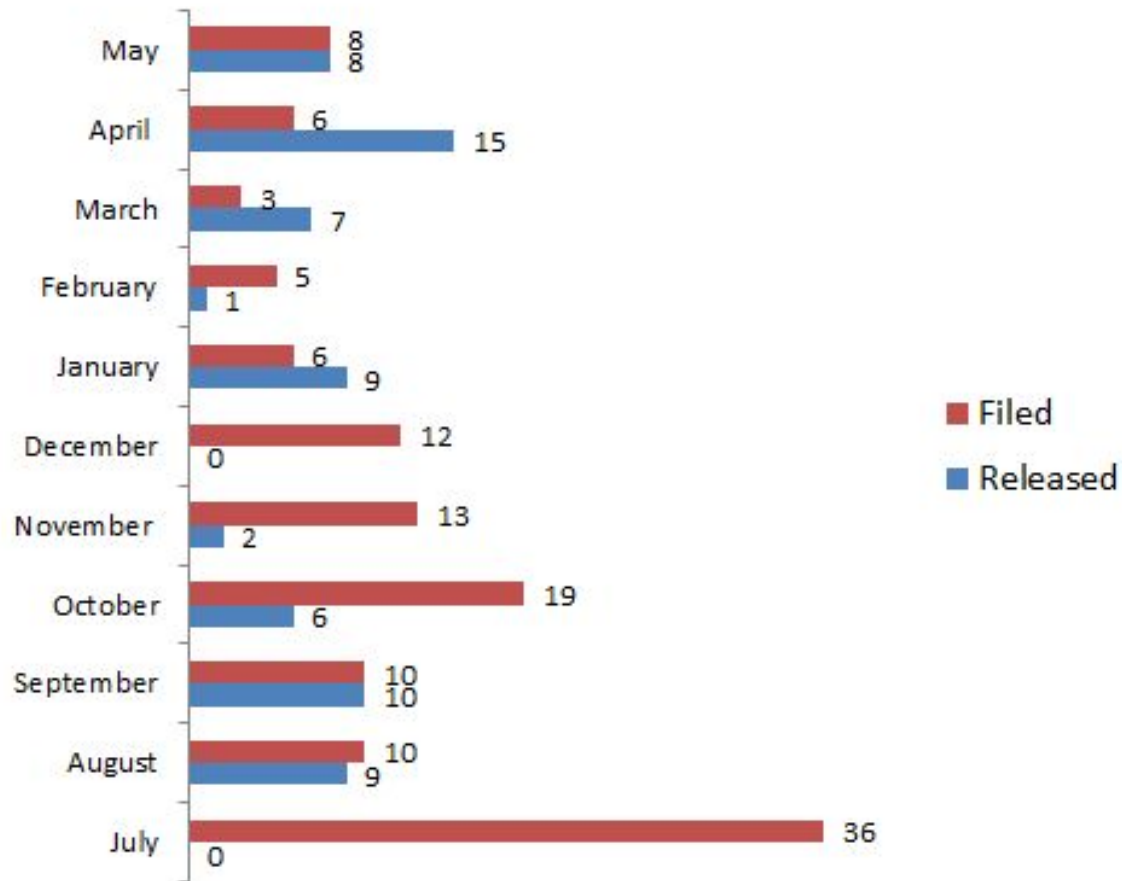
Property Tax Collection FY 18-19
