Monthly Summary









- Two new members were sworn in to the Police Department this month. Officer Brian Guilfoyle was a
 lateral transfer from Kentucky State Police, bringing 10 years of experience. Additionally, Recruit Jarod
 Lonaker will be attending the Police Academy for 20 weeks which began June 28th. Recruit Lonaker
 will graduate in early December.
- Erlanger PD handled all calls for service in Independence for 12 hours while they dealt with their officer-involved shooting.
- Officers worked the I75 Corridor Blitz on June 9th. During the Blitz dispatch advised of a wrong way, possibly armed driver on I75 north. Officer Dennison observed the vehicle, which had already struck multiple vehicles. He initiated contact and was successful in taking the suspect into custody without injury to the public, officers, or the suspect. The purpose of the I75 Corridor blitz is to decrease aggressive driving. This was a great example of what our officers do.
- On June 17th, Carolyn Fultz, a valued long-time member and retired Telecommunicator of the Erlanger Police Family, passed away at 79 years old. Carolyn began her career with the City of Erlanger, as a police and fire dispatcher in June of 1990, serving in this capacity until her retirement in April 2008. However, her dedication and service did not end! Carolyn returned to serve as a police clerk and retired in June of 2020 as the clerk for the Erlanger Codes Enforcement division. Carolyn was the Police "mom" to those who worked with her. She cared very much for her Erlanger family! She will be missed!

Canine Unit

Narrative: For the month of June, both canine teams saw time away from the road. Sgt. Clark and Bodo are still on leave from knee surgery. Sergeant Clark has returned to light-duty status as of June 28, 2021, and is hopeful to be released back to full duty in the near future. Specialist Hartke and Keno saw time away due to three-weeks of military training. The canine team has received their new drug safe system replacing their current but very outdated safe system. Sgt. Clark looks to have the new safe system installed during the month of July. The drug safe system allows the canine teams to safely maintain illicit drugs that are used to train the canine teams. Both canine teams are training to prepare for their yearly certification testing with the North American Police Work Dog Association (NAPWDA). This national certification allows the canine teams to hold an accreditation that is

accepted as the industry standard within the courtroom. The certification for NAPWDA is scheduled for September 2021 in Valparaiso, Indiana.

Comments: Comments: On June 28, 2021 at approximately 1450 hours Officer Rose initiated a traffic stop on Baker Street and Commonwealth Avenue. Officer Rose requested a K9 for a vehicle sniff. Officer Hartke arrived on scene and deployed K9 Keno; being a nationally certified canine team through NAPWDA and OPOTA to detect odors such as marijuana, methamphetamine, cocaine, heroin, and their derivatives for a vehicle sniff. During the initial pass around the vehicle K9 Keno showed changes of behavior by changes of breathing pattern, gait and change of search pattern at the drivers side open door. During the detail pass around the vehicle K9 Keno showed changes of behavior by change of search pattern, gait, and changes of breathing at the drivers side open front door as well as the b pillar seam. Search of the vehicle yielded multiple rolled dollar bills, a pack of Zig Zag rolling papers, and multiple small plastic baggies. Officer Rose searched the occupants and located on the passenger in her jean pocket a small folded piece of paper containing a small amount of methamphetamine. Driver stated they smoke marijuana every day.

Criminal Investigative Division

This month Net Connect has begun the process of installing the camera system for the Police and City buildings. They are expected to complete the process by June 30. Detectives assisted the Edgewood Police Department with serving 3 search warrants on cell phones. Detectives also recorded several cell phone downloads for various cases in Erlanger. Detectives also accepted 15 new cases this month.



Community Resource Officer



This month a court order was executed resulting in the final disposition of over 230 pieces of evidence being disposed of. Approximately two dozen items were delivered to the KSP Northern Laboratory for analysis on June 7th, and more than 150 items were destroyed in a quarterly drug incineration June 16th. Over 60 items were collected for the month. Upgrades to the evidence property rooms included multiple video cameras placed inside the rooms, processing area etc.

Ofc. John Hines conducted First Aid, CPR and Narcan training for the majority of the department. These certifications are valid for two years and were obtained through the American Heart Association.

Administrative work was completed on recruit Jerod Lonaker. Several training travel arrangements were made for officers required in-service courses and training files on new employees are being updated.
