Canine Unit

Narrative: During the month of October, the canine teams conducted two different drug sniffs at Lloyd High School. The K9 teams both made public contacts with the students during their lunch break one afternoon. Clark and Hartke spoke with students and staff, and let those who wanted to, come pet the K9s. Clark and Hartke conducted a K9 Demo for Girl Scout Troop #7293 hosted at Erlanger Baptist. The Troop was seeking their Animal Helper Badge. The teams spoke with the troop about how police K9 teams help the community, the role the K9s have within our agency, and answer any other questions the children had. Overall, the demo was a success and we are looking forward to taking more inquiries as COVID restrictions begin to relax. Specialist Hartke and Keno have been away from the road during the month of October for Paternity Leave and Military Training.

Notable Uses

Comments: On October 15, 2021 at approximately 2300 hours Officer Hartke was contacted by Sergeant Clark for a K9 call out to assist with the location of four juveniles who stole a car in Boone County and led the Sheriffs Office on a pursuit into Erlanger. During the pursuit the stolen vehicle was involved in striking a Boone County Sheriff's Deputy with the vehicle while he was deploying stop sticks. The pursuit led to The All in Cafe where the suspects had bailed from the vehicle and took off running. Officer Hartke arrived on scene while multiple agencies and K9 teams were working areas during a very heavy rain downfall and tornado warning. The multi-agency task force had three K9's working areas attempting to locate the suspects. Officer Hartke stayed in a vehicle mobile in the area along with other units and the perimeter. Officer Hartke saw a pending call for an open gate on Cardinal Court. Officer Hartke was handling the issue at which time a homeowner on Woodward Street called in that a car pulled up and honked and four juveniles ran from the woods and jumped in the vehicle. Woodward Avenue was directly behind the Cardinal Court call. Sheriff's Deputies and Officer Hartke were able to initiate a traffic stop on the back lot of AJ Lindeman Elementary School. Officer Hartke deployed K9 Keno for the felony stop. Officer Hartke and K9 Keno took position next to the Sheriff Officer giving commands to the vehicle. K9 Keno assisted in the apprehension of the four suspects involved in the attempted murder of the Boone County Sheriffs Deputy. K9 Keno's presence deterred the suspects from running or committing any further crimes.

Comments: On October 12, 2021 at 0026 hours, Sergeant Clark responded with his canine partner Bodo to assist Officer Dennison with the Erlanger Police Department with a traffic stop.

The canine team arrived at 0028 hours to assist. Sergeant Clark made contact with the lone occupant of the vehicle, Kim Perkins. Sergeant Clark advised Perkins of the canine deployment, had her step out of the vehicle, and pat her down for weapons. During this time, Kim made direct eye contact with a black bag/purse near the center console. Canine Bodo was then deployed for a vehicle sniff. During this time, Officer Dennison was simultaneously working on his state citation for the traffic/equipment violations.

The canine team Clark/Bodo are a nationally certified dual-purpose canine team through the North American Police Work Dog Association (NAPWDA). More specifically, canine Bodo is trained to detect and alert to the odors of marijuana, methamphetamine, cocaine, heroin, and any of their derivatives. The canine team has been partnered together since 2017, and have been responsible for hundreds of drug related arrests over the past four years.

Canine Bodo was deployed for a vehicle sniff. Bodo worked around the vehicle showing changes in behavior at the driver side door handle and B-pillar seam. Audible breathing pattern changes, body posture, focused search area, and his ear/tail positioning were observed indicating Bodo was in drug odor. The changes in behavior exhibited by Bodo, provided police with probable cause to search the vehicle. A search of the vehicle yielded various packages of suspected methamphetamine, two different Methocarbamol pills which are legend drugs, one Gabapentin pill a schedule 5 controlled substance, and paraphernalia associated with snorting methamphetamine and packaging. A cut straw and suspected methamphetamines' folded up in money were inside of a black purse located near the center console, exactly where Kim had looked prior to exiting the vehicle.

Kim Perkins was arrested and lodged at the Kenton County Detention Center. Refer to Officer Dennison's report for further.

Criminal Investigative Division

The CID this month received 5 juvenile investigations from the Northern Kentucky Children's Advocacy Center(NKCAC) and Department of Community Based Services. Detectives attended 5 interviews at the NKCAC this month. Detectives also met with the Department of Homeland Security along with the US Attorney's Office on an investigation that the detectives are involved in. Detectives were called out to a crime scene and along with the Patrol Division were able to make an arrest for Wanton Endangerment and Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon. Detectives also participated in drivers training and firearms training.

Late update:

Following weeks of negotiations and a pronounced court appearance, Robert Poole changed his plea today in Judge Bartlett's court. Poole was indicted for multiple counts of human trafficking and attempted human trafficking. He pled guilty to five felony counts of Promoting Human Trafficking and has agreed to plea guilty to three additional felony counts in Boone. His fine will be in excess of \$50,000 and may go as high as \$130,000. His licence to practice law was suspended and will almost certainly be revoked for life. We began looking at this case in 2017 and were officially asked by the Attorney General to investigate in March of 2018. Over the last three and one half years, many of you have had direct involvement in the investigation. With approximately 40 identified victims and 17,000 pages in the electronic and paper files, it's safe to say that this has been an extremely complex case. Thank You to everyone who directly contributed to this investigation and thanks to everyone who had to carry an additional share of the load because of this case. Poole will return to Bartlett's court in December for sentencing.

Community Resource Officer

Erlanger Police have teamed up with Miles Elementary School and offered an award for the top performing class in each grade for the highest number of completed Lexia lessons. This occurred during the entire month of October and a pizza party will occur during the month of November. Officer Loudermilk conducted a coffee with a cop in council chambers, and set up the Cocoa with a Cop on December 4th. Officer Loudermilk attended the Kenton County Detention Center and Coca Cola's trunk or treat.

Training / Evidence Management

Practical Driving Training was conducted at the Florence Y'all's lot this month. Officers were trained on advanced driver evaluation skills on a closed course consisting of mostly backing maneuvers. Firearms qualifications were conducted at the Williamstown Range, including low light and secondary weapons.

In-service training plans for 2022 have started. All sworn officers are required to complete 40 hours of Kentucky Law Enforcement Council approved training. That catalog will be published at the end of October 2021, subsequently 2022 classes will be scheduled.

The department's annual physical fitness testing is ongoing this month. All Sworn Officers are tested on Bench Press, Sit Ups, Push Ups, a 300 meter sprint and a 1.5 mile run. Results are pending.

An annual evidence audit was conducted by Chief Rader. All areas of evidence storage and processing were inspected and a random audit was conducted with 100% compliance on all items reviewed. Each item is checked for accuracy in description, condition and storage location. Over 100 individual drug items were destroyed, per court order, according to drug destruction protocol this month. Arrangements are being made to bring both evidence vaults into "OSHA" compliance. Ofc. Eagler completed a 40 hour evidence property room course at the Kentucky Department of Criminal Justice Training.

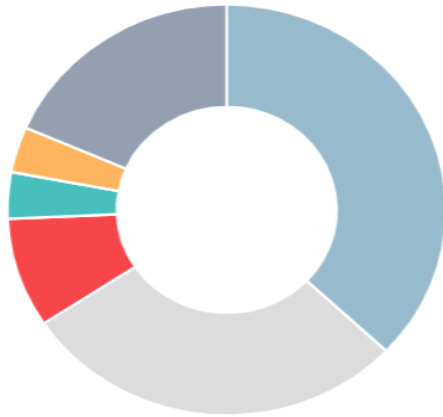

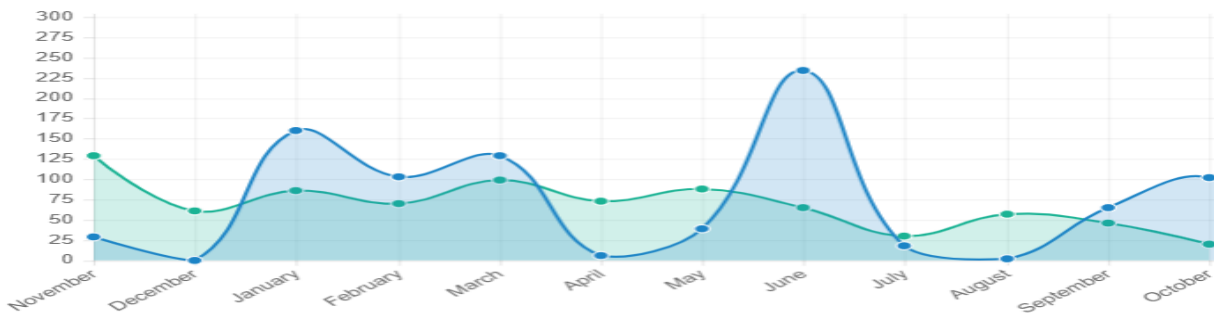
