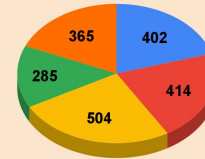


PROGRAMS

Mowing

The PW's crews have **34** city owned properties that are mowed weekly. These properties range from facilities, parks to ROW's. The city also contracts out **13** other properties such as alleyways and other green spaces. PW's crews worked **402** man hours in September keeping the City looking Exceptional.

October 11th

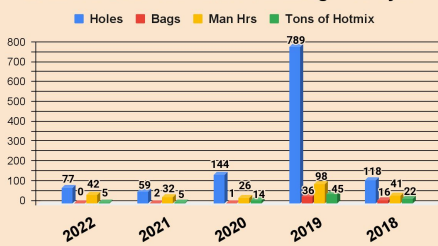
This course helps participants to identify and understand their own behavioral style. Through team building activities, participants will learn how to work more effectively with their own personality type and others in team settings.

Participants will learn how to identify invasive weeds, mowing guidelines, tree and brush removal and chemical pesticide usage and storage.

Choke Points

The PW's department has choke points throughout the city that are checked for debris before and after a substantial rainfall to prevent flooding issues. PW's refer to these areas as the "Trashy Ten". The Trashy Ten were checked twice during the last quarter which is the driest time of the year utilizing **9** man hours to keep them clean.

Leaf Collection

It is that time of year again for the trees to start losing their leaves and making for beautiful scenery as well as a nuisance for homeowners, clogging up gutters, sitting in curb lines and clogging storm drains. Silverlake Park Restroom

The new Silverlake Park restroom project has been completed, Thanks to Radius Construction for all their efforts bringing this project to completion.

Asphalt Paving Project

Michels Construction has been awarded the Jacqueline Drive, Kimberly Drive, Mitten Drive and Debbie Lane resurfacing and sidewalk project, this project is still on track to begin early October.

Concrete Street Reconstruction Project

Jefferson Contracting has begun the Sigma Drive, Kappa Court and Theta Court reconstruction project, this project has started on Kappa Court and will move to the end of Sigma Drive working their way out to Lambda Drive with Theta Court to follow.

Underpass Painting Project

A pre construction meeting has been held with Baynum Solutions, the awarded contractor for the underpass painting project. The next steps will be administering insurance and right of entrance permits to Norfolk Southern. This has been an experience as we get another step closer to new paint.
