




PROGRAMS

Leaf Collection Program

The 2022 Leaf Collection program came to an end on Friday, December 9th. The crews continued into the next week cleaning up leaves at the City Building and all the City Parks. As you can see on the chart, this year was the highest number of loades collected in the 5 year span but the man hours went down. This is due to an Exceptional program put together by the crew in the way they run the routes to the dumping of the leaves.







Christmas Tree Recycling

The annual Christmas Tree recycling program will run from December 26th through January 10th, 2023, when the trees will be mulched by Kenton County Public Works and will be disbursed among several county parks as bedding and for paths. The trees can be dropped off at the Erlanger Public Works facility on Jack Scheben Dr.



CAPITAL PROJECTS

Asphalt Paving Project

Michels Construction has began the Jacqueline Drive, Kimberly Drive, Mitten Drive and Debbie Lane resurfacing and sidewalk project. They started on the small cul de sac end of Jacqueline Drive. Due to the time of year and weather, some delays can be expected.

Concrete Street Reconstruction Project

Jefferson Contracting has completed Kappa Court and Sigma Drive this fall. Theta Court will begin Spring of 2023.

Public Works Montgomery Drive

Public Works Team Members have been working with members of the Viox Team and PCA Architecture to get the new Public Works Facilities out to bid. This project will go out to bid on January 4, 2023 and sealed bids will be received up to and opened at 10:00 am on January 24, 2023.

F/Y 2024 Street Improvements

The Public Works Team has been working with the City Engineer on plans for the upcoming year in order to get these projects out to bid as soon as the budget is approved in order to get on the contractor's schedule for the construction season.



TRAINING

Training has slowed down during the winter months as it has done for years due to limited classes offered and the possibility of having to miss a class due to weather. The PW's crews continue to do in house training on various topics all winter long. During the next month, the PW's Operation Manager along with the Crew Leads will sit down and schedule training for the first half of the new year.

Choke Points

The PW's department has choke points throughout the city that are checked for debris before and after a substantial rainfall to prevent flooding issues. PW's refer to these areas as the "Nasty Nine". The Nasty Nine were checked 2 times utilizing 18 man hours to do so.

Weather Warriors

The month of December brought one of the worst storms right before Christmas that this area has seen in a long time followed by a small system that moved thru the day after Christmas. The Weather Warriors crews ran 4 continuous 12 hours shifts to combat the big storm but it was a challenge due to the negative temperatures and worked a routine 6 hour shift for the small system. The crews used 255 man hours and 358 tons of salt for the two events.


2022 YEAR END TOTALS





