

REGULAR MEETING  
ERLANGER CITY COUNCIL  
May 2, 2023

Mayor Jessica Fette called the regular meeting of the Erlanger City Council to order in the City of Erlanger Council Chambers at 7:00 P.M., Tuesday, May 2, 2023.

Andrew Singh, Erlanger United Methodist Church, gave the invocation.

Members of City Council and citizens pledged allegiance to the flag.

Mr. Gatlin read the first reading of an ordinance adopting a budget for the City of Erlanger for the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2023, and providing that no monies shall be expended by or on behalf of the City of Erlanger except in accordance with that adopted budget.

Mr. Gatlin read the first reading of an ordinance approving and adopting a supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the City.

Mr. Gatlin read the first reading of an ordinance repealing Chapter 44 of the Erlanger Code regarding boards and commissions.

Mr. Gatlin read the first reading of an ordinance adopting an updated Chapter 44 of the City of Erlanger Code.

Mr. Gatlin read the first reading of an ordinance amending Section 104 of the Erlanger Code of Ordinances related to enforcement procedures.

Mr. Gatlin read the first reading of an ordinance adopting an amended interlocal agreement between the Kenton County Fiscal Court and the cities of Bromley, Crescent Springs, Crestview Hills, Edgewood, Elsmere, Ft. Wright, Independence, Kenton Vale, Lakeside Park, Ludlow, Park Hills, Ryland Heights, Taylor Mill, and Villa Hills for code enforcement in Kenton County, Kentucky.

Mr. Gatlin read Municipal Order No. 05-02-23-01 appointing Mike Stubblefield to the Kenton County Joint Code Enforcement Board. M/S, Hermes-Reckers, to adopt the municipal order as read. All ayes, no nays, motion carried.

Mr. Gatlin read Municipal Order No. 05-02-23-02 making the written determinations required by KRS 82.083 for the sale or other disposition of property owned by the City. M/S, Kyle-Jasper Lucas, to adopt the municipal order as read. All ayes, no nays, motion carried.

Mr. Gatlin read Resolution No. 05-02-23-01 authorizing the Mayor to execute the "One Stop Shop" and service level/cost sharing agreement. M/S, Kyle-Reckers, to adopt the resolution as read. All ayes, no nays, motion carried.



M/S, Hermes-Niceley, to adopt the resolution as read. All ayes, no nays, motion carried.
