Meeting Minutes – July Meeting

Discussion Items:

7 Mile Garden Project

- We have the boulder and the plaque for the 7 Mile Garden.
- Ribbon cutting is on Wednesday, September 27 at 2:00 p.m.
- Press coverage: NKY Link, channels 19, 9, 106.7 radio channel
- Put up a tent in Bonded Lock, refreshments
- Mayor Fette and Councilwoman Diana Nicely will make remarks
- John Stevenson will sing My Old Kentucky Home
 - Kevin will let Todd/Johnna know if they would like a harmonica intro/after John sings
- Parking situation to be determined

Status of the Container Program

We will prioritize the tree program and put this on hold

Spring Tree Planting Initiative

- Meg shared her experience with the Fort Thomas tree program; she has a sample of the tree application that she can share.
- It is a cost share program; the tree is guaranteed for a year; the homeowner keeps the water bag filled. The city installs the tree and mulches it.
- Cost for the tree is what the homeowner pays; \$150-200 approximately
- They had a limit, depending on budget (tree trimming, tree removal current tree removal budget for City of Erlanger is \$10K).
- Limit to March through May; goal is to plant 5 a month.
- Meg shared the idea to save money on postage, send along with the tax bill as a filler.
- Would need to promote it/ market it on Facebook and City of Erlanger; too late for this year's tax bills. We will start promoting it in January 2024.
- The Commission with Fort Thomas decided where the tree needed to go and also work with the homeowner on where it would be placed.

- Meg will collect some information for us from the Fort Thomas program and bring it back to our next meeting.
- We will decide in the September meeting which trees we will offer.
- Covington has two arborists on staff; Erlanger works with Davy Trees.
- Site One has a wide variety of landscape products.

Kenton Lands Project

- We will be installing a butterfly garden, lighting, sculptures, fencing, etc. on Kenton Lands by Silverlake.
 - o Bidded out for one butterfly and three smaller ones.
- Will be removing the boxwoods that were burned this winter.
- Discussed the possibility of "theming" the sculptures throughout the city. Keep it habitat-focused, this would also allow us to make areas more natural with wildflowers.
 - o Flagship Park could incorporate bee statues
- Start date to be decided
- Will do clearing this fall and winter; prep the area in early March.

General Discussion

- How often do we want to meet throughout the winter? Meet in September and October; consider not meeting in November and December (would need to have the Spring Tree Planting initiative marketing strategy and process ready to go in January).
- The Beautification Task Force met on Tuesday this week; some similarities in the work we do.
- War Memorial at the corner of Dixie and Commonwealth: Kevin asked us to evaluate this
 property and get recommendations on what to do in terms of trees/landscaping.
