CONGRATULATIONS TO KIM WOLKING

I am excited to announce that Kim Wolking's Depot Days program was selected as one of the Kentucky Recreation and Parks Society's (KRPS) Outstanding Program-Class 1 recipients for 2023.

Kim started Depot Days in 2016 with only three scheduled events. Seven years later it has grown to include two events per week for eight weeks, totaling sixteen events overall and twenty-four hours. This past summer, 2566 individuals attended and participated in the program.

Depot Days offers an array of events that exposes Erlanger's residents to experiences they may never have the opportunity to participate in, such as milking a cow. The program is not only a collaboration with the Kenton County Public Library and Erlanger-Elsmere School District, but other city departments as well. Residents are given the opportunity to meet our employees while learning what they do in a fun way.

I am proud of Kim and her Depot Days program. Kim and the City of Erlanger will be recognized as a recipient of this honor at the KRPS Awards Night on November 15th at the Capitol Theatre in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

FRIENDSHIP GARDEN WALL RECOGNITION

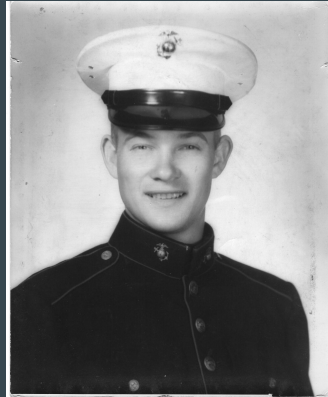

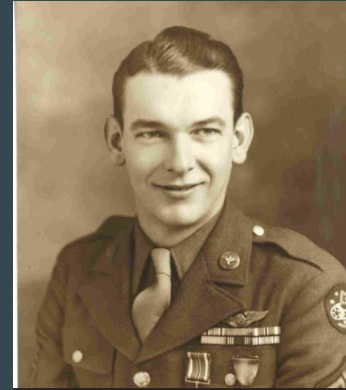

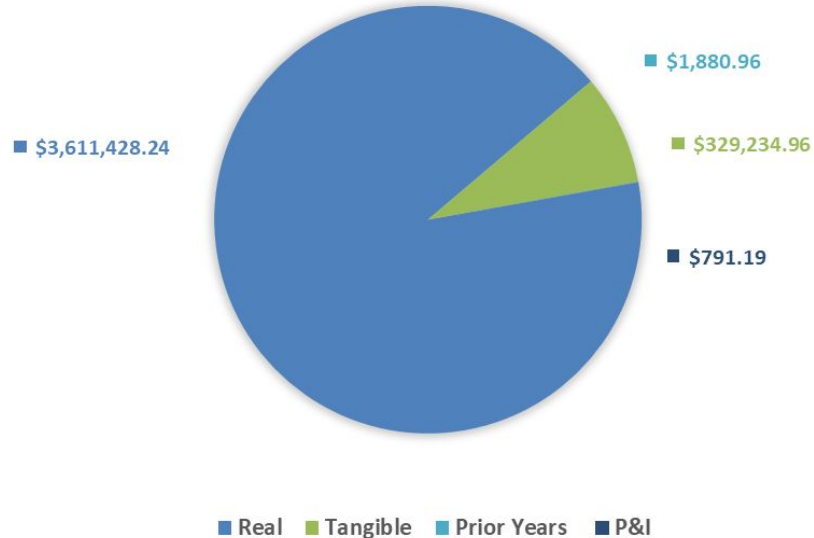
PROPERTY TAX COLLECTION

REAL ESTATE & PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX TAX YEAR 23-24

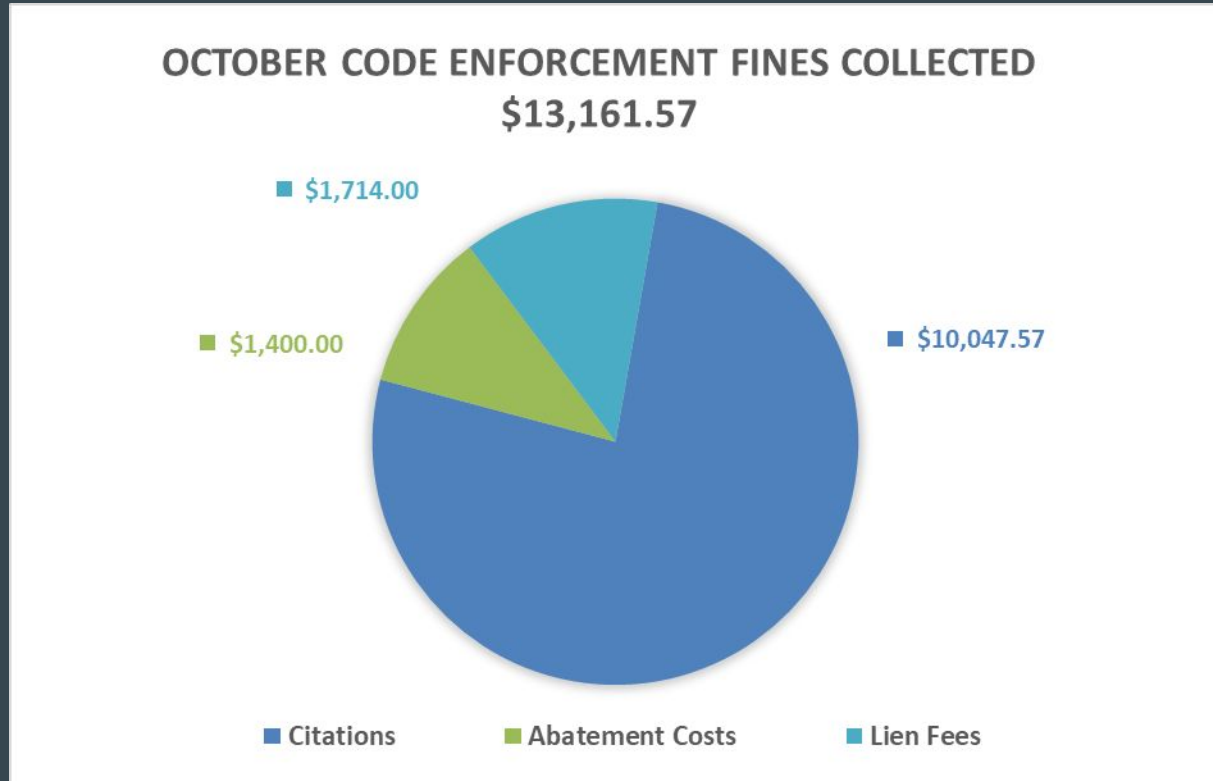

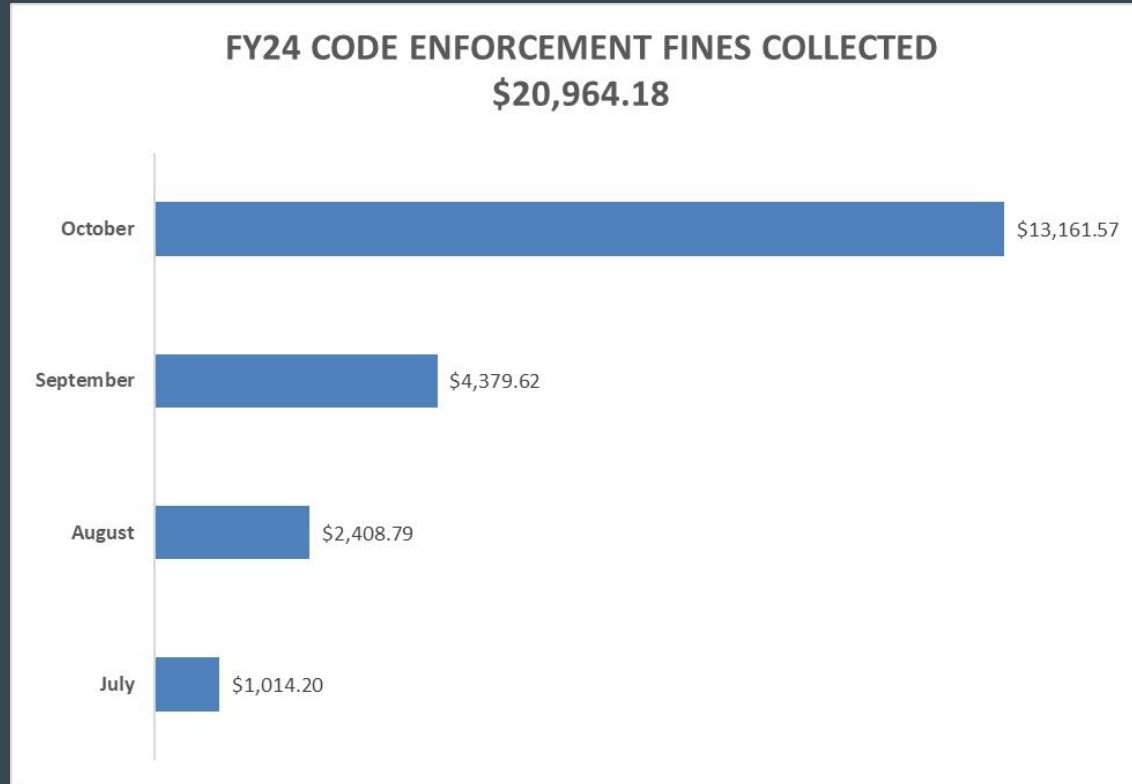
OCTOBER REAL ESTATE & PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX COLLECTION \$3,943,335.35



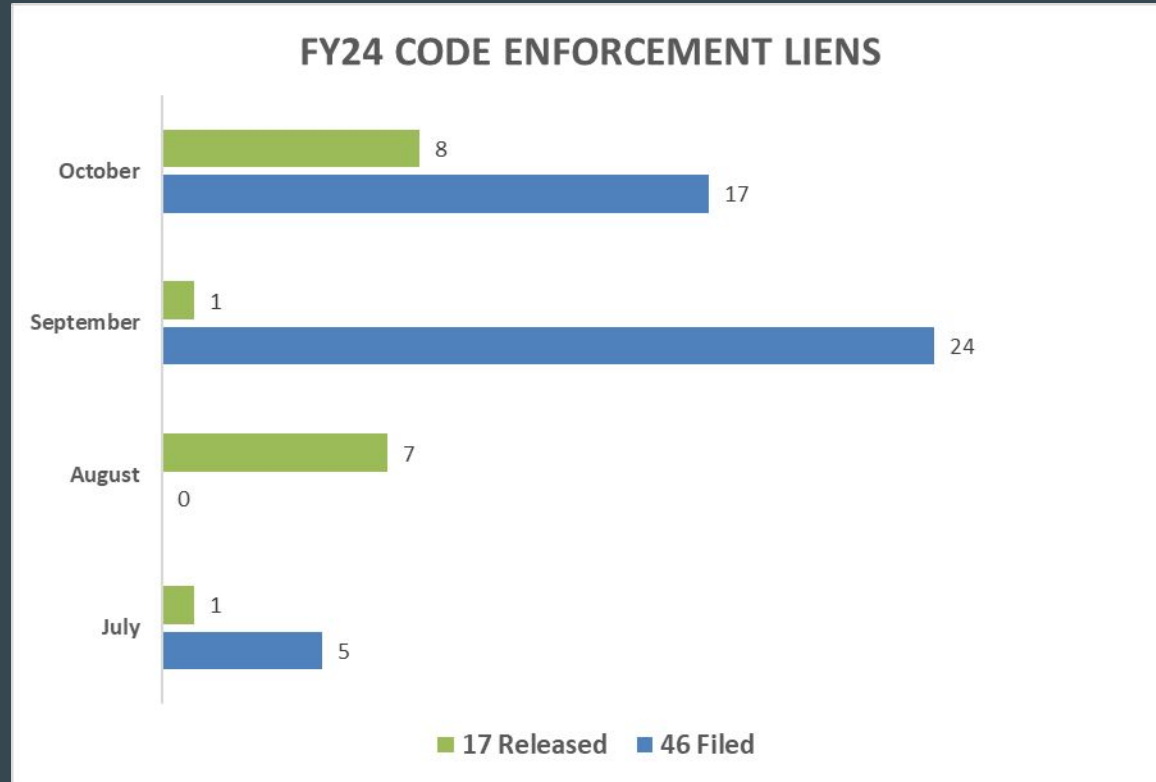
CODE ENFORCEMENT FINES COLLECTED

CODE ENFORCEMENT LIENS



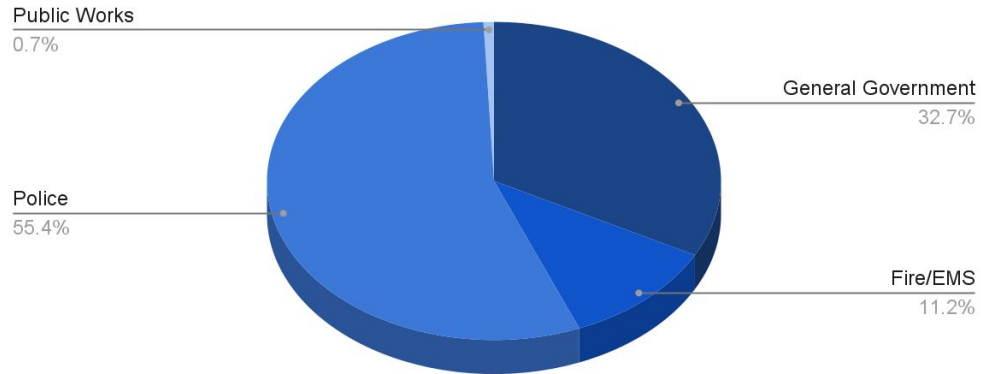
PASSPORT FEES COLLECTED



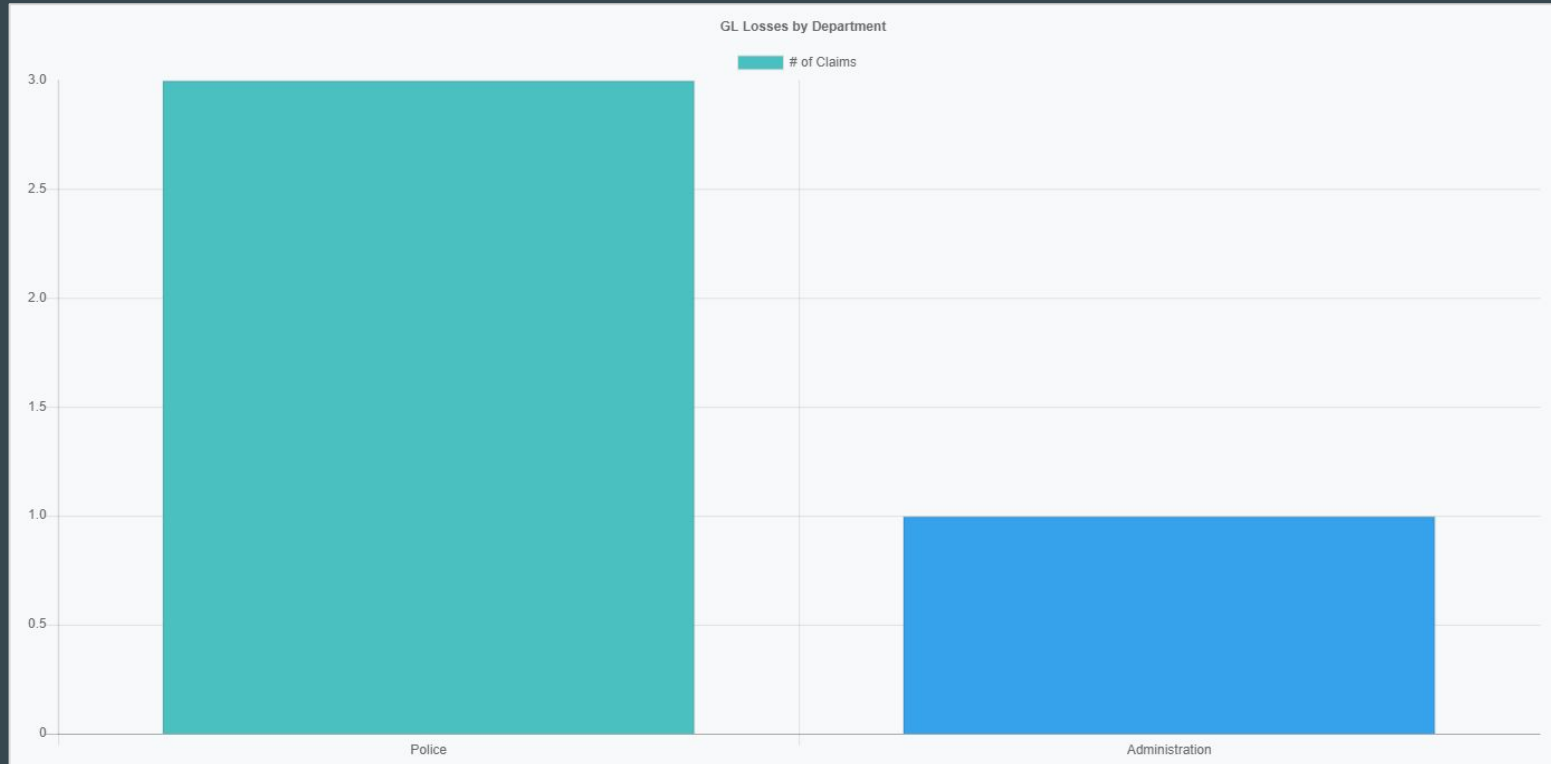

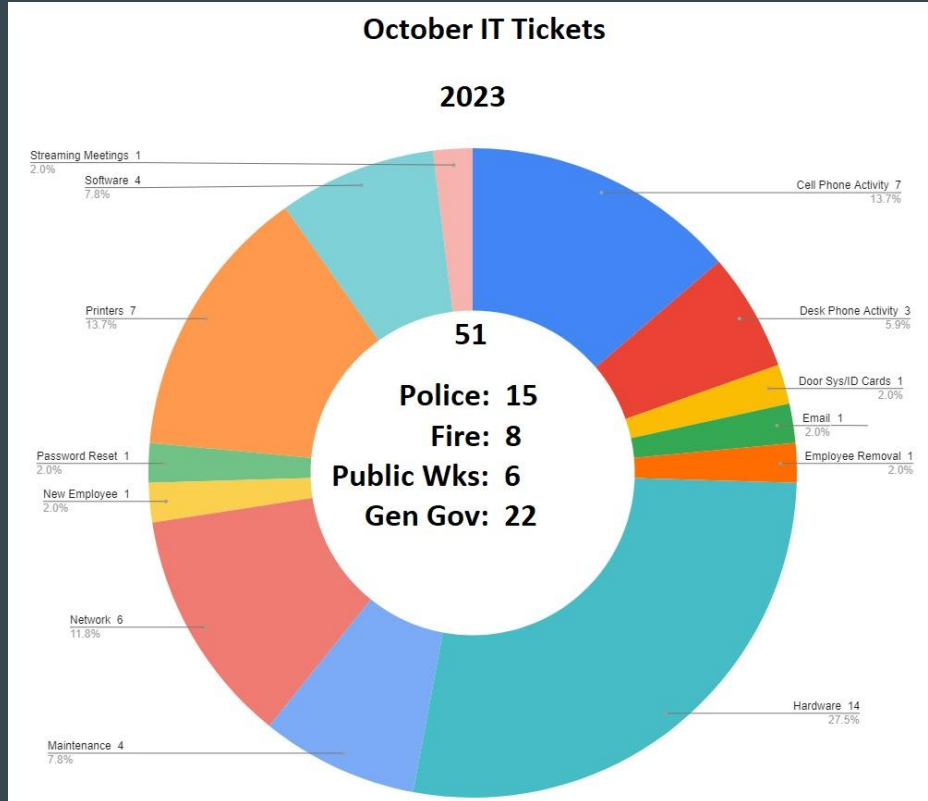
