

January 2024 MONTHLY REPORT



Programs / News:

- The Erlanger Police Internship program has begun for the Spring 2024 session. Three interns will participate for 6 weeks each and come together 3 times for a group "field trip" each 6 week session. The first intern is underway and all 3 interns participated in F.A.T.S training on Jan 23rd.
- The Police Social Worker program is doing great. Maryann continues to build a network of resources and options for our officers and community to utilize.
- Ofc. Eagler has joined the board of directors of the Tri-State Peer Support team. "The mission of the Tri-State Peer Support Team is to effectively recognize and respond to another first-responder or family member who is experiencing emotional or physical symptoms from exposure to acute or chronic high-stress incidents. The Tri-State First Responder Peer Support Team will respond by listening, referring, and supporting those in need."
- 2024-2025 Kentucky Office of Highway Safety Traffic Grant applications were submitted. This continues to be a great partnership with a significant impact on traffic issues in our community.

Training:

- Officer Centers is doing well in his FTO post academy. Officer Plunkett is performing well in the Police Academy and Officer Page is finishing his online portion of the Police Academy.
- January is Response to Resistance Training. Fire Arms Simulator Training (F.A.T.S) is underway. Officer Eagler will oversee the training of Erlanger Officers, surrounding NKY agencies, and several civilians.
- Erlanger Officer will all complete a review and test of current Response to Resistance topics and laws.

Investigations/Case Highlights:

- The Detectives office and Crime Scene Team assisted the Kenton County Detectives and Crime Scene Team in Taylor Mill. Evidence collected in a Child Pornography case resulted in the arrest of an adult male for a total of 228 counts of several child predator related charges.
- A social media threat to Erlanger Elsmere Schools was investigated by the PD, SROs, school board and federal agencies this month. It was determined to have no credibility, but the teamwork and response by all were a great effort in the safety of our students and community.
