Investigations/Case Highlights:

- After school officials received information regarding the potential of a firearm on the campus, Erlanger Detectives, SRO, and Command Officers worked in collaboration with the schools to identify and take into custody the student who brought a firearm to school. The student was taken into custody and the firearm was seized.
- The Crime Scene Unit assisted the Kenton County Crime Scene Unit in several investigations this month. Two of the investigations were search warrants. The 3rd investigation was a death investigation involving the recovery of skeletal remains.
