


Programs / News:

- Training / Evidence Officer Eagler joined the board of a start-up association consisting of Kentucky
 Evidence Managers and custodians. This is a new effort to help coordinate, assist, and better standardize
 property and evidence rooms, related policies and procedures

Training:

- Officer Brad Diel completed field training and is working patrol on his own.
- Firearms simulator training has begun. Ofc. Eagler, Loudermilk, and Sgt. Ohara will be training our officers and many of the NKY agencies this month and next.

Investigations/Case Highlights:

- Patrol assisted in the search and apprehension of a burglary suspect in Covington. After attempting to car
 jack another victim, the suspect went over the bridge and was hiding under the bridge trellis. Our K9
 officer and Drone operator assisted in locating the suspect.
- Through combined efforts from patrol and our police social worker, we found some additional resources for an elderly resident that has been the subject of numerous calls regarding his mental health status. These steps will hopefully see him receive the long-term care he needs.
- Patrol assisted Independence Police with a dispute call involving multiple subjects and being reported as guns involved. Officer Lonaker responded to the area and located a fleeing subject and was able to assist in taking him into custody without further incident.
- Patrol located a 5yr old autistic child alone on Dixie Highway. Through investigation the family was located. Patrol worked with our police social worker and cabinet to ensure the safety of the child.
