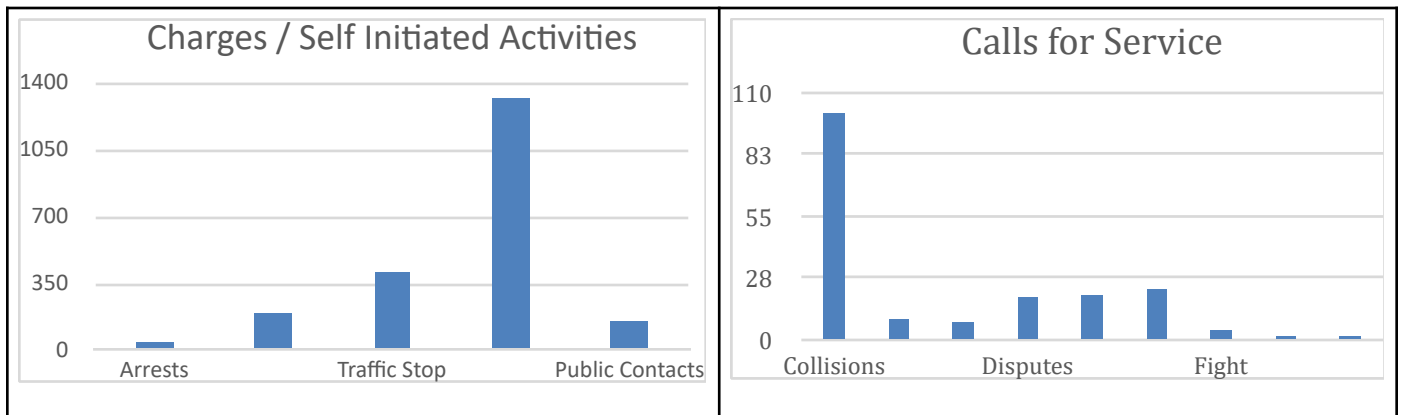

Programs / News:

- The Police department received 4 Ballistic Shields on a grant from the Attorney General's Office
- Each officer received a front and back ballistic rifle plate for their vests (90 total) on the grant from the Attorney General's Office

Investigations/Case Highlights:

- Patrol has been active this month in criminal investigations
 - Officers sought a search warrant of a phone to assist in solving a theft case
 - Several felony drug arrests
 - Provided assistance to the NKY Drug Strike Force in apprehending a suspect
 - Patrol has been testing a new feature in AXON that will translate as they are talking with the community. This has been a great assistance in multiple investigations
