- The Police Department participated in the annual Senior Luncheon at the DAV
- The Kentucky Women’s Law Enforcement Network (KWLEN) Conference was hosted in Covington. This is a statewide conference and this year welcomed officers from both Ohio and Virginia

Investigations/Case Highlights:

- Both K9 officers assisted in tracks of fleeing suspects that were both taken into custody this month without further incident or injury.
- Officer Centers assisted the Strikeforce with an investigation in which he located and stopped the suspect. Officer Centers received a letter of commendation from the Director of the NKY Strikeforce for his efforts and joint agency cooperation.
- There were several successes utilizing the FLOCK camera system this month to include a recovered stolen vehicle and methamphetamine arrest, and the apprehension of a hit and run suspect for a neighboring city.
- The drone was utilized on 2 occasions this month to located subjects having an emotional crisis. Both subjects were located and officers were able to assist them without further incident or harm to themselves
