

MONTHLY REPORT



Programs / News:

- Officers participated in the annual COPS n Kids event.
- Officer Ryle was recognized at the annual Governor's Impaired Driving Award Banquet for her work in DUI apprehension and Police Phlebotomy work.
- Erlanger Police received a SOTOXA device for impaired driving from KY Office of Highway Safety.
- The Police Department received ballistic helmets for all officers on a grant from the Attorney General Office

Training:

- Department annual training for Taser recertification began
- Officers Semler, Ryle, and Loudermilk all finalized their test for EMT Certification
- Officers completed online traffic construction safety certification for upcoming highway construction details
- Officers Semler, Loudermilk, Ryle, and Lt. Klare attended Sotoxa training with KY Office of Highway safety. Officers Semler, Loudermilk, and Ryle conducted roll call training to ensure all of patrol has been trained on the new device.
- The Detectives and the Crime Scene Team conducted "mock crime scene" training

Investigations/Case Highlights:

- Patrol located a wanted fugitive from Ohio at Red Roof Inn, who was armed and attempted to flee. The suspect was apprehended without incident and had multiple warrants from out of state.
- Patrol assisted Indianapolis Police with a homicide investigation. The suspect possibly drove a vehicle to Erlanger and asked his girlfriend to destroy evidence in the murder. The vehicle was not located.
- Patrol investigated a missing elderly male with dementia. After several hours and collaborating with both the fire department and multiple police agencies, the male was located unharmed.
- The detectives investigated two death cases this month. One initially was investigated as a possible homicide, but homicide was ruled out by investigation.
