



Programs / News:

- Lt. Ryan Atchley was sworn in as the Secretary of the Kenton County Chief’s of Police Association
- The K9 Teams held a demonstration at Lakeside Presbyterian for the “Elderberry’s” group
- Officer Tori Monson was welcomed back to the road from maternity leave this month and is patrolling on A squad 1st shift.
- The 2026 Spring high school internship program is underway. The 1st intern (from Lloyd) is currently about half way through the 6-week program.
- The 2026 State Accreditation is underway. The state will audit the Police Department Policies for best practice and compliance. This is done every 4 years and will be a process that will be completed in March.

Training:

- Firearms Training Simulator (FATS) is underway with our agency and a large number of agencies in NKY
- Officer Allgeier, Officer Diel, and Officer Taylor have started the next round of EMT training
- A large number of evidence items (300) have been compiled awaiting the court order for disposal
- Officer Eagler and PSW Moore are continuing their work with Tri-State Peer Support. PSW Moore initiated a sleep awareness initiative with patrol during this shift change time frame.

Investigations/Case Highlights:

- Patrol successfully saved a dog who had entered into a freezing lake in the Nelson /Ashmont Area
- Patrol investigated a social media video involving juveniles and a firearm. The investigation resulted in the seizure of 2 firearms, and through further investigation was determined that one of the firearms was involved in a shooting in Cincinnati. Charges are pending.
- There were 3 Drug Recognition Evaluations and 5 Police Phlebotomy blood draws this month in impaired driving investigations.
- The Detectives Office had 28 new investigations opened this month and closed 25 of their open investigations.
